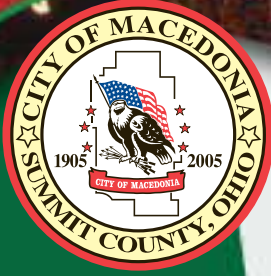

a MESSAGE *from our Mayor*

I just want to take this opportunity to sincerely thank the people of Macedonia for voting on Election Day. Getting out and marking a ballot is a freedom that not all people of the world enjoy, and a right for which we should be thankful for. The vote of confidence I received is a great honor, and I am proud to continue my work on behalf of our residents and businesses alike.

As your new Mayor I will be continuing to try and move Macedonia forward with infrastructure. In progress as this is written is a traffic study in the hopes to address the traffic mess that we experience with the closing of Highland Road. The end of summer found us in an arduous position of highly congested daily driving due to the two month long closing of Highland for construction, that is part of the two year construction we will be forced to endure starting April 2012. The City must rise to the occasion and any changes in detours, re-routing, signalization, or whatever, must be run past O.D.O.T. before the City will be allowed to proceed. We are not allowed to do what we think we should do. We are allowed to do something that O.D.O.T. thinks would benefit the health, safety, and welfare of those using our streets. That decision will be made by the traffic study being performed by an Engineering Company by the name of U.R.S.

Along those same lines we are once again addressing the designated limited access part of State Route 8 in our City. As many of you may remember this was tried when the "Crossings", where Lowes and Giant Eagle are located, opened. It was not doable. Since that time we have had major changes in traffic patterns with the completion of the Route 8/ Interstate 271 intersection. We will also be adding to the mix located at the left turn light for the "Crossing" with the opening of our new Aldi's and the joint use of access to Spitzer Chevrolet. There may be a possibility to have more development north of Aldi's if there were to be access to and from Route 8. With a Casino coming in Northfield on Route 8, who knows what ancillary business might be attracted. This could increase the tax sharing between Northfield Center and Macedonia. This could contribute to sources of revenue other than taxes.

Talking about businesses...what can we do to help those affected by the upcoming Highland Road closure due to the 2012 bridge project. First of all, as concerned residents, we can go out of our way to patronize them. Some of the businesses rely heavily on us, and if it means going out of your way, please do that to go to them.

We need them to survive because the businesses of Macedonia are a revenue mainstream for the services you receive. The City Council has before it Legislation to forgive the admittance tax for Fun-n-Stuff. This is a way to help a particular type of business that will benefit all of the businesses. If we do this for them, our County Councilman, Nick Kostandaras, is working with Officials from Summit County to offer, upon proof of business loss, County tax abatements. This may be the very first gesture made to those businesses affected by road construction anywhere. Mayfield Road and Euclid Avenue are two prime examples of the negative effect of road construction. If this happens and works...it will send a message to the whole business community that Macedonia and Summit County want you to locate here. We recognize the value and importance of our businesses more than anywhere else in the country. Please locate your business facility here.

We need a bridge

We need them.

They need us.

Still in the works and gathering momentum is Phase Three of Route 82. This will be the final step in addressing our Main corridor from border to border. Phase Three will continue the much needed modifications of Rt. 82 from the vicinity of Conrad's going East to the Twinsburg City Limits. The road will be 3 lanes wide with curbs and stormwater piping. That is still due to happen in 2013.

South Bedford Road improvements is reliant on the Transportation Bill before Congress. Upon passage at the Federal Level, the money that we have secured will be used to fix South Bedford Road with curbs, storms, and sidewalks. We have been waiting for passage of that Bill for almost three years. Congressman Steve LaTourette is our guardian in Washington and he is looking over us. The last Transportation Bill allowed us to finally complete the Route 82 widening and bridge. Having our Congressman in times like this, and for reasons such as this, is literally worth its weight in gold.

MOODY'S ISSUES Aa3 BOND RATING

Moody's Investors Service has assigned a Aa3 rating to the City of Macedonia's (OH) General Obligation Various Purpose Refunding Bonds, Series 2011. Concurrently, Moody's has affirmed the Aa3 rating on the city's outstanding GOLT debt.

The bonds are secured by the city's general obligation limited tax pledge, which is subject to the ten-mill limitation defined in Ohio law. The bonds will retire outstanding maturities of the city's Various Purpose Bonds, Series 2001 and 2003 for expected interest savings of \$373,000, or 7.4% of the refunded bonds' par value. The Series 2001 bonds were issued to construct the Macedonia City Center and Macedonia Family Recreation Center and the Series 2003 bonds were issued to refund the 1998 Series, which funded a recreation center project. Assignment and affirmation of the Aa3 rating reflects the city's medium-sized tax base located in both the Cleveland (general obligation A1/stable outlook) and Akron (general obligation Aa3) metropolitan areas; satisfactory financial operations despite reliance on economically sensitive operating revenues; and modest debt levels.

STRENGTHS

- Solid financial reserves and growing unrestricted liquidity
- Voter approval for a temporary income tax rate increase through the end of 2013
- Stable tax base and favorable proximity to Akron and Cleveland

CHALLENGES

- Reliance on economically-sensitive income tax revenues

WELL-MANAGED FINANCIAL OPERATIONS EXPECTED TO MITIGATE THE IMPACT OF RECENT REVENUE PRESSURES

Due to well-managed operations and recent success with ballot initiatives, we expect the City of Macedonia's financial position to remain stable. Macedonia, like many Ohio cities, is heavily reliant on income tax revenues to support municipal operations, with 54% of fiscal 2010 General Fund revenues derived from income taxes. Income tax receipts declined in both 2009 and 2010 by a significant 12.3% and 7.6%, respectively. Management responded to declines in income taxes and shortfalls in other revenues by delaying capital improvement projects, reducing payroll by over \$600,000 and cutting administrative expenses by \$240,000. Consequently, the General Fund balance declined by a relatively modest \$200,000 in fiscal 2009 and rose a substantial \$1.1 million in fiscal 2010, ending fiscal 2010 with a General Fund balance of \$2.6 million, or 25.2% of revenues.

We believe that management's willingness and ability to pursue revenue enhancements and reduce expenditures in order to maintain satisfactory financial operations supports the assignment of the Aa3 rating.

The Answer is NO!

No Matter What the Caller Says, You Were Not Awarded a Government Grant

Consumers from our neighboring counties reported to the Office of Consumer Affairs that they received calls yesterday afternoon from the Washington DC Treasurer's Department Grant Division or a similar "government" agency to inform them that they have been awarded a government grant.

The caller explains that they need to verify the information they have regarding the consumer such as name, address and age, is correct. When the consumer confirms the information, the caller asks for bank or credit card account numbers. One consumer was hesitant to provide account numbers, and was given a number to call for additional information on how to receive his grant.

"Government grant scams promise "free" money to pay for education, home repairs, start a small business or pay bills. To receive your grant money you will be asked for bank account information or to wire money to pay upfront fees or taxes," said Cynthia Sich, Director of the Summit County Office of Consumer Affairs. "With the holiday season upon us, consumers may receive an increase in phony telemarketing calls aimed at taking your money."

Remember, the government will **NEVER** telephone, email, or mail any offers for grants. To receive a legitimate government grant you must apply in writing and there are no fees for the application process. To learn more about the types of government grants and their requirements visit www.grants.gov.

Just because the caller knows your name, address, and telephone number does not mean they are legitimate. Be wary of names such as "federal," "stimulus package," "government" or "grant." Even if the caller's name sounds official or legitimate the caller is not!

Don't trust anyone who requests upfront payments or advance fees. Never send money to a stranger through a wire transfer, courier service, or allow anyone access to your bank account.

Consumers should always check out companies offering government grants, guaranteeing you a loan or offering sweepstakes or lottery winnings by calling the County of Summit Office of Consumer Affairs. These are financial scams solely designed to take your money or identity.

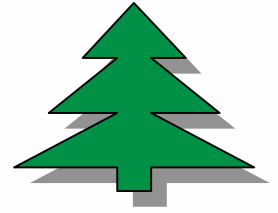

2011 Rabies Vaccination Clinic for Dogs and Cats

Stow, Ohio – Summit County Public Health will be sponsoring a Rabies Vaccination Clinic in the City of Twinsburg.

Vaccinations will be administered on Saturday December 3rd from 10:00AM until 2:00 PM at the **Twinsburg City Police Department Maintenance Garage** located at 10075 Ravenna Road.

The clinics are for dogs and cats only. Veterinarians from **PetGuards** will provide the vaccines and other shots listed below. No appointment will be necessary.

- Rabies vaccine 1 & 3 yr (pet must be at least 3 months old) \$5 per animal
- Cat shot (annual booster) \$12 per animal
