CITY OF MACEDONIA, OHIO ORDINANCE NO. 12 - 2023

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT FOR DONATION OF THE REAL PROPERTY KNOWN AS PERMANENT PARCEL NOS. 33-00010, 33-00012 AND 33-03316

WHEREAS, the City of Macedonia makes every effort to encourage the proper development and beneficial use of real property within the City's boundaries; and

WHEREAS, certain real property located off of Valley View Road, which is currently owned by a private entity known as 9150 Group, LLC, has sat largely dormant for an extended period of time with little-to-no beneficial use made of said property during that period; and

WHEREAS, the City administration has been in negotiations with the entity known as 9150 Group concerning certain real property owned by that entity, which it now desires to donate to the City of Macedonia, with the understanding that certain requirements may need to be met by the City concerning the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council now determine that accepting the donation of approximately 5.80 acres of real property having a current address of 9150 Valley View Road and bearing permanent parcel number ("P.P.N.") 33-00010, 33-00012 and 33-03316 for public purposes is in the best interest of the City and its residents; and

WHEREAS, Council therefore desires to authorize the Mayor to enter into an agreement to accept the donation of the real property known as P.P.N.s 33-00010, 33-00012 and 33-03316.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Macedonia, County of Summit and State of Ohio:

<u>Section 1</u>. That the Mayor is hereby and herein authorized and directed to enter into an agreement to accept the donation to the City of Macedonia by 9150 Group, LLC of certain real property with the current address of 9150 Valley View Road, Macedonia, Ohio 44056 and known as P.P.N.s 33-00010, 33-00012 and 33-03316.

Section 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

Any owner of land use for agricultural production may file an application to have the land placed in an agricultural district.

B. What is land used for agricultural production?

Land is devoted to agricultural production when it is used for commercial, apiculture, animal husbandry, poultry husbandry, the production from commercial purposes of field crops, tobacco, fruits, vegetables, timber, nursery stock, ornamental shrubs and trees, flowers or sod, or any combination of such husbandry or production including, but not limited to, the processing, drying, storage and marketing of agricultural products.

C. What does " tracts, lots, or parcel of land," mean?

Tracts, lots, or parcels mean distinct portions of pieces of land (not necessarily contiguous) where the title is held by one owner, as listed on the tax list and duplicate of the county, is in agricultural production and conforms to the requirements of D1, D2, or D3.

D. Are there any other requirements?

- 1. The land for which the application is made must have been used exclusively for agricultural production or devoted to and qualified for payments or other compensation under a land retirement or conservation program under an agreement with a federal agency for the three consecutive calendar years prior to the year in which application is made. Evidence must be shown on the application. If the land contains timber, which is not being, grown for commercial purposes the land on which the timber is growing must be contiguous to or part of a parcel under common ownership that is otherwise devoted exclusively to agricultural use.
- 2. If the total amount of land for which application is made is less than 10 acres, there is an additional requirement that the applicant submit evidence with his application that the activities conducted on the land have produced an average yearly gross income of at least twenty-five hundred dollars over the three years immediately preceding the year in which application is made or that the land will produce an anticipated gross income of that amount.
- Evidence of annual gross income may be satisfied by attaching to the application form a short statement stating the number of animals by species and anticipated market value, number of acres of crops to be grown, their expected yields and price per bushel or similar specific information.

E. Instructions for completing application

- · Print or type all entries
- · List description of land as shown on the most recent tax statement or statements. Show total number of acres.
- Describe location of property by roads, etc., and taxing district where located. State whether any portion f land lies within a municipal corporation.
- For land to be taxed at current agricultural use valuation, an initial application must be submitted to and approved by the Fiscal Officer and a renewal application must be submitted each year thereafter for land to be continued in the CAUV program. If the acreage totals 10 acres or more, do not complete part D.
- If the acreage totals less than 10 acres, complete either D (1) or (2). Do not use space at the bottom of form below dotted line.

F. Where to file?

The completed application must be filed with the Summit County Fiscal Office where the land is located. The applicant will be notified of action taken by the Fiscal Office within 30 days of the filing of the application if the land is not within a municipal corporation or an annexation petition has not been filed. If the land for which an application has been made lies within a municipal corporation limit or if an annexation petition that includes the land has been filed with the Summit County Fiscal Office under section 709.03 of the Ohio Revised Code. The application must also be filed with clerk of the legislative body of the municipal corporation. The legislative body is required to conduct a public hearing on the application within 30 days after the application has been filed with the clerk. Within the 30 days of the hearing, the legislative body may approve the application, modify and approve the application as modified, or reject the application.

G. When to file?

The original application may be filed at any time for placement of land in an agricultural district for a five-year period. If at the end of five years, the owner decides to keep some or all of his land in a district, he shall re-apply and must meet the same land requirements and use the same application process as the original application. The renewal application may be filed at any time after the first Monday in January and prior to the first Monday in March of the year during which an agricultural district terminates, for a period of time ending on the first Monday in April of the fifth year following renewal application.

H. Appeal of Application

The applicant may appeal the denial of the application to the court of common pleas of the county in which the application was filed within thirty days of the receipt of the notice denying the application. When the land lies within a municipality the applicant may also appeal a decision to modify or reject and application to the court of common pleas of the county in which the application was filed within thirty days of the receipt of the notice of modification or rejection. In additions, the applicant may withdraw an application modified by a legislative body if he disapproves of the modifications.

CITY OF MACEDONIA ORDINANCE NO. 26 - 2023

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH SPECIALIZED CONSTRUCTION, INC. FOR THE 2023 ROAD PROGRAM

WHEREAS, pursuant to the authorization set forth within Resolution 5-2023, the City previously advertised for bids for a contract concerning various roadway repair and improvement work for the City's 2023 Road Program, including preventative maintenance items; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to law, bids were received and opened by the City in accordance with the published schedule, and the City Engineer has reviewed and recommended that the bid received from Specialized Construction, Inc. be accepted as the lowest and best bid; and

WHEREAS, it is found and determined that the bid of Specialized Construction, Inc. is the lowest and best bid with regard to the 2023 Road Program, and Council therefore wishes to authorize the Mayor to enter into a contract with Specialized Construction, Inc. for such 2023 Road Program repairs and improvements as the lowest and best bid.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Macedonia, County of Summit and State of Ohio:

- <u>Section 1</u>. That the Mayor is authorized to accept the bid of Specialized Construction, Inc. as the lowest and best bid in regard to the 2023 Road Program for certain repairs and improvements within the City of Macedonia as set forth in the documents attached hereto and incorporated by reference as Exhibit "A," and to enter into a contract with Specialized Construction to accomplish the same.
- Section 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance was adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.
- <u>Section 3</u>. This Ordinance shall take effect upon adoption by Council and signature of the Mayor or after the earliest period allowed by law.

CITY OF MACEDONIA ORDINANCE NO. 27 - 2023

AN ORDINANCE

AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH PERRIN ASPHALT COMPANY FOR GOLDEN LINK BOULEVARD RESURFACING

WHEREAS, it has already been deemed necessary and in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of all the City and its residents to resurface Golden Link Boulevard, a portion of which is located within the City of Macedonia, and a portion of which is located within Northfield Center Township Ohio (for which a cooperative agreement was previously entered into between the City and Township); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the authorization set forth within Resolution 15-2023, the City previously advertised for bids for a contract for certain resurfacing work on Golden Link Boulevard; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to law, bids were received and opened by the City in accordance with the published schedule, and the City Engineer has reviewed and recommended that the bid received from Perrin Asphalt Company be accepted as the lowest and best bid; and

WHEREAS, it is found and determined that the bid of Perrin Asphalt Company is the lowest and best bid with regard to the resurfacing of Golden Link Boulevard, and Council therefore wishes to authorize the Mayor to enter into a contract with Perrin Asphalt Company for such paving improvements as the lowest and best bid.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Macedonia, County of Summit and State of Ohio:

- <u>Section 1</u>. That the Mayor is authorized to accept the bid of Perrin Asphalt Company as the lowest and best bid in regard to the resurfacing of Golden Link Boulevard as set forth in the documents attached hereto and incorporated by reference as Exhibit "A," and to enter into a contract with Perrin Asphalt to accomplish the same.
- Section 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance was adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.
- <u>Section 3</u>. This Ordinance shall take effect upon adoption by Council and signature of the Mayor or after the earliest period allowed by law.

CITY OF MACEDONIA ORDINANCE NO. 28 - 2023

AN ORDINANCE

AMENDING SECTION 1 OF ORDINANCE 79-2022 WHICH ESTABLISHED THE COMPENSATION SCHEDULE FOR THE NON-UNION CITY EMPLOYEES OF MACEDONIA EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2023

WHEREAS, Council of the City of Macedonia, upon the recommendation of the Mayor, wishes to amend Section 1 of the compensation scheduled previously established for the non-union employees of the City as set forth in Ordinance 79-2022, in order to account for the newly-created part-time position of "Communications Specialist" within the Mayor's Office.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of Macedonia, County of Summit and State of Ohio:

<u>Section 1</u>. That Section 1 of Ordinance 79-2022 be, and hereby is, amended as follows:

Section 1. That effective January 1, 2023 the following employees which are exempt from the collective bargaining units, shall be assigned to the designated paygrades. Where the ranges of pay are specified below in Sections 1 through 4, the Mayor shall determine the specific salary or wage applicable, which compensation shall be within the given paygrade unless expressly authorized by Council:

COMMUNICATIONS SPECIALIST Part-Time (29 hours per week)

DEFINITION

Under general supervision, to assist in performing para-professional administrative work related to the City's public information platforms and outreach programs; to assist in preparing and disseminating informational materials to the public and news media; to assist in preparing marketing publications concerning City services, activities, programs, events and functions; to assist in coordinating events for the City; and to perform other related work as required.

SUPERVISION RECEIVED AND EXERCISED

Receives general supervision from the Mayor and/or Designee. May exercise work leadership over interns and volunteers and/or provide guidance and leadership for daily activities, assigned projects or tasks as assigned.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

Class specifications are intended to present a descriptive list of the range of duties performed by employees in the class. Specifications are not intended to reflect all duties performed within the job.

- 1. Researches, drafts for approval, and disseminates timely and accurate City related information to the public through various outlets including, but not limited to, social media, email notifications, press releases, newsletters, articles, special presentations, reports and other related channels.
- 2. Assists in the development and implementation of a comprehensive communications program for the City which identifies audiences, messages, communications tools and evaluation measures.
- 3. Monitors and updates the various City related social media accounts, pages, and groups on the all applicable platforms.
- 4. Evaluates and measures mobile and social media program success and impact; monitors trends in social media tools, trends, applications and appropriately applies that knowledge to increasing the use of social media for the City.
- 5. Represents the City at assigned meetings, functions, or events as assigned while fostering positive relationships with partner agencies, community groups, non-profit organizations and the community.

- 6. Assists in coordinating events for the City, including, but not limited to, event logistics, registration, attendee tracking, presentation and materials support, and pre- and post-event evaluations.
- 7. Researches and recommends new and alternative ways to maximize public outreach to enhance community outreach and engagement and increase public awareness of City happenings.
- 8. Maintains and updates the City's community calendar with timely, accurate and detailed information; works collaboratively with partner agencies to ensure all City related events are relayed to the public.
- 9. Assists in developing multi-media presentations as required, including power point slide shows, displays and photographic exhibits.
- 10. Develops, edits and designs all City promotional items, event flyers, social media graphics and other materials as required.
- 11. Assists with receiving visitors and telephone calls; provides information and handles issues that may require sensitivity and use of sound independent judgment; assists with responding to requests for information and complaints referring matters to appropriate City staff.
- 12. Interacts with co-workers at all levels in the organization in a collaborative and customer service-oriented manner.
- 13. Maintains archives of press articles related to City news; track media response along a variety of indicators (e.g. positive, negative, message portrayed, etc.); prepare report of results for City leadership as assigned.
- 14. Assumes responsibility for ensuring the duties of the position are performed in a safe, efficient manner.
- 15. Assists with directing incoming mail and email communications; determines the priority level and routes incoming correspondence, reports, requests and instructions; handles or refers matters as directed.
- 16. Performs related duties as assigned.

EXPERIENCE, TRAINING, AND LICENSE

Any combination of experience and training that would likely provide the required knowledge and abilities may be qualifying. A typical way to obtain the knowledge and abilities would be:

Qualifications:

Graduation, or near completion, from an accredited college or university with the equivalent to a Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university with major coursework in Public Relations, Journalism, Communications, Marketing, or a closely related field; and a minimum of one year of progressively responsible experience involving the development and coordination of public affairs, public information, community outreach and social media marketing; or an equivalent combination of training and experience.

License/Certificate:

Possession of a valid Ohio driver's license and a satisfactory driving record.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES:

Knowledge of:

Techniques and methods used in the development and evaluation of communications; principles and practices of research, journalism, graphic design, layout and production; fundamentals of photography, video-photography and cable-casting; personal computer operation; software applications including graphics and desktop publishing systems; interviewing techniques, communications, media services and resources; organization, services and functions of municipal government; pertinent federal, state, and local laws, codes and regulations; principles of supervision, training and performance evaluation; and local government process, management and governance; safe work methods and safety regulations.

Ability to:

Develop, organize, and coordinate a communications program; communicate effectively, both orally and in writing; gather and verify news information through interview, observation and research; analyze administrative problems, evaluate alternatives and make creative recommendations; advise on most effective techniques of information dissemination; exercise judgment in release of information; give information rapidly, accurately and tactfully; prepare press releases, news articles, presentations, reports and other written materials in a timely manner; prepare and present a variety of communications materials; write and edit newsletters and news releases; prepare flyers and reports; prepare and give presentations; edit materials for proper punctuation and grammar; establish and maintain effective working relationships with City officials, employees, the public and news media; coordinate activities with other divisions and City departments; operate a personal computer and applicable software including graphics and desktop publishing systems; provide excellent customer service; skillfully and safely operate a motor vehicle where required in the course of performing work duties.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

Ability to attend special City events including weekends, evenings and holidays, as required.

Ability to attend night meetings and work extended hours, as needed and/or required.

Graphic Design experience is highly desirable.

Photography and videography experience is highly desirable.

PHYSICAL AND MENTAL DEMANDS

The physical and mental demands described here are representative of those that must be met by employees to successfully perform the essential functions of this class. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

Physical Demands:

While performing the duties of this class, the employee is constantly required to sit and frequently stand, walk, talk and hear, both in person and by telephone; use hands or fingers to handle, touch, or operate standard office equipment; and reach with hands and arms. The employee occasionally reaches for item(s) above or below desk level, and lifts and carries records and documents, typically weighing less than 20 pounds. Specific vision abilities required by this job include close vision and the ability to adjust focus. Travel by vehicle while conducting City business.

Mental Demands:

While performing the duties of this class, the employee is regularly required to use oral and written communication skills; exercise sound judgment in the absence of specific guidelines; establish priorities and work on multiple assignments and projects concurrently; meet intense and changing deadlines given continual interruptions; and interact appropriately with staff, management, City officials, Boards, Commissions, contractors, consultants and others encountered in the course of work.

WORKING CONDITIONS

The employee typically works in an office and field environment. Non-traditional work hours may be required in order to accommodate the City's needs including attendance at City Council meetings, special City events, and matters requiring the presence of the City's Communications Specialist. These hours may include, but are not limited to: weekends, evenings and holidays. Occasional driving is required to attend special meetings at various City facilities, training sites, and public and private events. The employee may be required to travel using public transportation.

CITY OF MACEDONIA RESOLUTION NO. 31 - 2023

A RESOLUTION URGING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS AND THE OHIO GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO IMMEDIATELY ENACT LEGISLATION TO FURTHER PROTECT THE CITIZENS OF THE CITY OF MACEDONIA, OHIO FROM THE DANGERS POSED BY TRAIN DERAILMENT ON RAILROAD TRACKS LOCATED IN THE CITY OF MACEDONIA, STATE OF OHIO, AND THROUGHOUT THE UNITED STATES

WHEREAS, commercial railroad tracks are located throughout the City of Macedonia, Ohio, including tracks running across State Route 82, and are also located in other Ohio political subdivisions and run throughout the United States; and

WHEREAS, certain train operators operate on these train tracks, twenty-four (24) hours of the day, seven (7) days a week, including train operators such as Amtrak, BNSF Railway, Canadian National Railway, CSX Transportation, Kansas City Southern Railway, Norfolk Southern Railway, Union Pacific Railroad, as well as other rail road operators and entities; and

WHEREAS, just in the past few weeks, two train derailments have occurred in the State of Ohio, and these derailments have caused, and will continue to cause, significant issues, medical and/or otherwise, to the residents of the communities where the incidents occurred, and the incidents caused, and will continue to cause, serious damage to the infrastructure located in proximity to derailment sites, and said incidents have caused and will continue to cause serious damage to the ecosystem; and

WHEREAS, from the facts known at this time, it appears additional regulations enacted through the federal and state legislatures (relating to railroad tracks, rail cars, railway employees, etc.) can and will assist in preventing such derailments in the future, thereby protecting residents of the City of Macedonia, residents of the State of Ohio, and residents throughout the United States from the harms caused by such derailments; and

WHEREAS, the City of Macedonia wishes to join other political subdivisions in the State of Ohio and throughout the United States, who have been actively responding to and demanding that the federal and state legislatures immediately enact legislation to enhance protections for residents in the City of Macedonia, State of Ohio, and those residing across the country from the dangers, both inherent and otherwise, posed by train derailments.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Macedonia, County of Summit and State of Ohio:

- <u>Section 1</u>. That Council for the City of Macedonia, Ohio hereby determines that it is in the best interest of the City and its residents to urge the State and Federal legislatures to immediately enact legislation to create regulations to further protect the citizens of the City of Macedonia, State of Ohio, and citizens throughout the United States from the dangers posed by train derailments, whether in the City of Macedonia or otherwise.
- <u>Section 2</u>. It is found and determined that all the formal action of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution occurred in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of the Council, and any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions, were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.
- **Section 3**. Wherefore, this Resolution shall become effective upon its adoption by Council and signature of the Mayor or as otherwise be provided for in law.
