

Before You Hire a Contractor



follow these recommended tips to prevent becoming victim to contractor scams!!



ONLY WORK WITH LICENSED AND INSURED CONTRACTORS. Check with the Building Department to see if your contractor is registered.

OBTAIN THE REQUIRED PERMITS from the Building Department for the work to be done. Verify if contractor states he/she will obtain the permits.





OBTAIN AT LEAST THREE ESTIMATES from three different contractors. Beware of contractors that have only a few projects for you to review.

GET EVERYTHING IN WRITING. Including cost, work to be done, time schedule, guarantees and payment schedule. Don't be pressured into signing a contract right away. And never sign an incomplete contract.





REQUIRE AND CHECK REFERENCES. It is also a good idea to ask to see the salesperson's driver's license. Write down the driver's license and plate numbers.

CHECK OUT THE COMPANY'S REPUTATION with the Ohio Attorney General's Office and the Better Business Bureau.





NEVER PAY UP-FRONT. Do not make a large down payment. Instead, pay in increments – for example, one-third at the beginning of the job, one-third after half of the work is completed to your satisfaction, and one-third when the job is completed. **AVOID PAYING IN CASH** as it limits the paper trail if something does goes wrong.

Understand that **OHIO'S HOME SOLICITATION SALES ACT** provides consumers with a three-day cancellation period for most contracts signed at their own home. The law also applies to contracts signed at any location that is not a company's normal place of business (such as a home improvement show).





2023 is a Charter Review Year

Article XVIII, Section 18.02 of the city's charter calls for a Charter Review Commission to convene at least once every five years. The Commission will be comprised of six registered voters, appointed by the Mayor and Council. The duty of the Charter Review Commission is to review the charter "to insure that our government continues as modern as it should be." If the Commission makes recommendations for changes, Council then can vote to place those amendments on the ballot in the November election. If you are interested in being on the Charter Review Commission, please contact one of the Council members. Explaining Water-Related Bills


One of the most frequent questions that pop up on social media and in council inboxes is "What is this bill?" Since Macedonia's water, sewer and stormwater are managed by a myriad of providers, residents are often confused by those. Here's a quick rundown of water-related bills a typical Macedonia resident will receive throughout the year:

- City of Cleveland Division of Water:

Residents that have municipal water (not a well) are provided clean water to their homes from Cleveland Water. Billing is monthly and is based on use as determined by the meter in your home, plus any applicable fees. Cleveland Water uses Automated Meter Reading technology to wirelessly receive information about your usage. For more information and to view your usage and bills, visit www.clevelandwater.com or call (216) 664-3130.

- Summit County Division of Sanitary Sewer Services:

Also known as D.O.S.S.S or formerly known as D.O.E.S. Summit County sends a quarterly bill for sewer use, which is the removal of wastewater from your home (when not on a septic system). Our sewers flow to the Southerly Water Treatment Plant, part of the NEORSD (Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District). Summit County controls billing and pipe maintenance. Your wastewater bill is sent quarterly and is based on the amount of water used as per your water meter reading from Cleveland Water (see above) plus any applicable fees. For questions about rates and bills, call Summit County D.O.S.S.S. at (330) 926-2400.





- Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District:

Also known as NEORSD. Macedonia is part of NEORSD's Regional Stormwater Management Program. This program manages stormwater runoff – literally, water from the sky (not from pipes). Some areas of the city, like those in the watershed of Indian Creek, are fully under the control of NEORSD. Most areas of the city will have stormwater-related issues addressed by the city engineer, but with guidance from NEORSD. Residents get a monthly bill from NEORSD, which is based on the amount of "impervious surfaces" on your property. That is, areas such as driveways, patios and buildings where rainwater can't enter the ground. The money from this monthly fee goes to NEORSD stormwater projects, including projects in Macedonia. For questions about rates and bills, and for more information on what the NEORSD Regional Stormwater Management Program does, visit the NEORSD website at www.neorsd.org or call customer service at (216) 881-8247.

- City of Macedonia Water Maintenance & Expansion Fund:

Also known as Water M&E. This fund was started in 1967 as a way for the city to expand the municipal water system to new homes and properties, and to maintain the system. The fund is still used to maintain the system. As Cleveland Water does provide water to Macedonia, there are some parts of the system that are under Macedonia's jurisdiction to maintain. Each property owner used to get a yearly bill for Water M&E, but in 2020 the yearly amount was "rolled in" to an assessment on property tax bills, eliminating the need for anyone to pay manually. All of these water-related services offer reduced rates or exemptions for seniors and disabled residents who live under a percentage of the poverty level. If you need help paying your bills, contact the provider/biller listed above for more information.


River Run Drive

Golden Link Blvd Re-Surfacing

Asphalt re-surfacing of Golden Link Boulevard, with the shopping center, is scheduled to re-surfaced in 2023. The City of Macedonia, in conjunction with our partner Northfield Center Township, has received a grant from the Ohio Public Works Commission in the amount of \$144,500, for the re-surfacing of Golden Link Boulevard.

Valley View Road Re-Surfacing

Asphalt re-surfacing of Valley View Road, from Twinsburg Road south to the Macedonia City Limits, is now scheduled for 2023. The City of Macedonia has received a grant from the AMATS in the amount of \$292,000, for this project.




A Babysitters Guide to Fire Safety

How To Avoid a Scam

Block unwanted calls and text messages. Take steps to block unwanted calls and to filter unwanted text messages.

Don't give your personal or financial information in response to a request that you didn't expect. Honest organizations won't call, email, or text to ask for your personal information, like your Social Security, bank account, or credit card numbers.

If you get an email or text message from a company you do business with and you think it's real, it's still best not to click on any links. Instead, contact them using a website you know is trustworthy. Or look up their phone number. Don't call a number they gave you or the number from your caller ID.

Resist the pressure to act immediately. Honest businesses will give you time to make a decision. Anyone who pressures you to pay or give them your personal information is a scammer.

Know how scammers tell you to pay. Never pay someone who insists you pay with cryptocurrency, a wire transfer service like Western Union or MoneyGram, or a gift card. And never deposit a check and send money back to someone.

Stop and talk to someone you trust. Before you do anything else, tell someone — a friend, a family member, a neighbor — what happened. Talking about it could help you realize it's a scam.

Report Scams to the FTC

If you were scammed or think you saw a scam, tell the FTC at ReportFraud.ftc.gov.


