She stated that of the 5,000 Summit County residents Summit DD serves, 86 reside in Macedonia. The County is mandated to provide services, which include residential, employment and vocational, to developmentally disabled adults and their children. Summit DD has been operating from a levy that passed in 2005, and there has been no increase in funding since then. Passage of this replacement levy would cost homeowners \$158 per \$100,00 of appraised value and lock at current appraised values, not the increased values that will take effect in 2024.
