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INVOCATION & PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

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- **PROCLAMATION:** The Mayor read a proclamation celebrating the 100th birthday of Macedonia
- resident Anne Pustai. Ms. Pustai recalled notable moments from her life and had several family members

in attendance.

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APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

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Ms. Brandt moved, second by Mr. Garvas, to approve the minutes of the regular meeting of June 13, 2024 as received from the Clerk of Council. The motion carried by a unanimous voice vote.

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PUBLIC COMMENTS:

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~ Aaron Marcovy, 31360 Solon Rd. No. 33, Solon, speaking on behalf of NOPEC stated he was present to answer any questions Council may have regarding the PACE transaction on the agenda tonight. He shared that economic development is one of the best ways to be able to help foster the communities that are part of their council. Mr. Marcovy further shared that Ohio is second only to California in terms of PACE financing, and it is not just large skyscraper and stadium-type projects, but smaller communities and their projects.

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~ **Jose Delgado**, **31360 Solon Rd. No. 33, Solon**, also from NOPEC, echoed the thoughts shared by Mr. Marcovy and reiterated that NOPEC is a resource for Macedonia.

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~ Hannah Kelling, 2189 Riverside Dr., Lakewood, speaking on behalf of the Western Reserve Land Conservancy as the Southwest Field Director, provided context on RES 57-2024. The land in question is 115 acres just east of SR 8 and south of Highland Rd. The project has been worked on for the last five years to protect this space. Part of the process is coming to various public bodies asking for resolutions of support.

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Dir. Guidetti stated this piece of legislation adds cats into the animals at large and prohibition against feeding ordinances in the City's Code.

Dir. Wilson shared that two companies submitted bids and that Kimble was the best and lowest bid, with

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The Mayor added that the City was required to go out to bid for a new contract and price increases were fully expected, but fairly reasonable. No services are changing, and if approved, the contract will begin on December 1, 2024.

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Ms. Tulley moved, second by Ms. Brandt, to adopt ORD.NO. 44-2024 and post the same according to law. Motion carried by a unanimous voice vote. ORD.NO. 44-2024 declared and adopted.

To date, the City has not reached an agreement with four of the properties. This allows the City to go to the appropriation process, which means the project can move forward and settlement with the property owners will happen later.

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DEPARTMENT REPORTS Service Department: Director Wilson – Thanks for approval of the trash contract. Interviews taking place to fill positions. Meetings with Samsara to provide GPS tracking and forward-facing cameras in snow trucks. Working to hold CDL training in-house.

Finance Committee: Mr. Ventura stated the Finance Committee will meet prior to the Council work session on September 12 to go over eight months of financial reporting and the continuing five-year

Engineer: Director Gigliotti – Road paving work complete on Deepwood, Bendleton and Sensori. Work currently taking place on Riverview, Lawton, Cessna, Apache and Blackhawk.

Parks and Recreation Department: - Director Chadock - About 183 cars showed up to this evening's car show. August 8 is the Touch a Truck event. Fallfest will take place on Saturday, September 21 in Longwood Park. Concluding HVAC project, along with minor touchups to the pool deck. Summer programming will conclude August 16 and Fall programming will begin August 12.

Finance Department: Director Veres – July 15 has passed, so unless you have an extension with RITA you may no longer submit a resident refund form. A new accounts receivable administrator will start on August 2.

IT Department: Director Collins – 48 help desk tickets closed since the last Council meeting. Major projects include LEADS updates for the Police Department and new credit card machines at the Recreation Center.

Building Department: Commissioner Monaco – B&B Theaters tentatively scheduled to open the weekend of August 15-17. The structure at 1250 Twinsburg Road is being demolished. Some clarity was reached at the former BP location as the City had previously been citing the renters, but now will cite the property owners. Assistant Building Commissioner interviews will begin soon.

HR Department: Director Smith – Absent

Fire Department: Lieutenant Joe Natali – 2575 EMS and Fire calls to date in 2024. The City has been reimbursed by the insurance company for the diesel tanker that crashed on January 27. Lt. Natali shared details on recent fires in the City and the importance of working smoke detectors.

Police Department: Chief Yakopovich – Richard Quintrell was recently hired as a new patrol officer, and Kara Koch as a new dispatcher. Looking to hire more patrol officers and dispatchers, with the application and testing window for dispatchers set to open on August 1.

Law Department: Director Guidetti – At the request of the Mayor, Dir. Guidetti explained the right of way as it pertains to the area of land between the sidewalk and street. Many residents have misconceptions that these pieces of property are owned and maintained by the City, where in fact most of these areas are the obligation of the property owners to maintain.

CITY OF MACEDONIA ORDINANCE NO. 43 - 2024

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 505 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF MACEDONIA REGARDING CATS

WHEREAS, cats roaming at large, and the feeding of feral cats and certain other animals, create nuisance conditions for residents and others within the City of Macedonia, Ohio; and

WHEREAS, it is hereby determined to be necessary and in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of the City and its residents to amend Chapter 505 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Macedonia, Ohio regarding the regulation of cats located within the City;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Macedonia, County of Summit and State of Ohio:

<u>Section 1</u>. That Sections 505.01, 505.02, and 505.08 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Macedonia shall be amended to read as follows:

* * *

505.01 DOGS, CATS, AND OTHER ANIMALS RUNNING AT LARGE.

- (a) No person being the owner or having charge of horses, mules, cattle, bison, sheep, goats, swine, llamas, alpacas, geese, ducks, turkeys, chickens or other fowl or animals shall permit them to run at large upon any public place, or upon any unenclosed lands, or upon the premises of another.
- (b) No person being the owner of or having charge of any <u>cat or</u> dog, whether wearing a registration tag or not, shall permit it to run at large upon any public place or upon the premises of another. No owner, keeper or harborer of any female dog shall permit such dog to go beyond the premises of such owner or keeper at any time such dog is in heat, unless such dog is properly <u>io</u>n leash. The owner or keeper or every dog shall at all times keep such dog either confined upon the premises of the owner or keeper, or under reasonable control of some person.
- (c) The running at large of any such animal in or upon any of the places mentioned in this section is prima-facie evidence that it is running at large in violation of this section.
- (d) Whoever violates this section is guilty of a minor misdemeanor for a first offense and a misdemeanor of the fourth degree for each subsequent offense.

505.02 IMPOUNDING AND DISPOSITION; RECORDS.

- (a) A police officer or animal warden may impound every animal, cat or dog found in violation of Section 505.01. If the owner of the cat is not reasonably determined, or if the dog is not wearing a valid registration tag and the owner is not otherwise reasonably determined, notice shall be posted in the pound or animal shelter both describing the cat or dog and the place where seized and advising the unknown owner that unless the cat or dog is redeemed within three days, it may thereafter be sold or destroyed according to law. If the dog is wearing a valid registration tag or the identity of the owner, keeper or harborer is otherwise reasonably determined, notice shall be given by certified mail to such owner, keeper or harborer that the dog has been impounded and unless redeemed within fourteen days of the date of notice, it may thereafter be sold or destroyed according to law. Any cat or dog seized and impounded may be redeemed by its owner, keeper or harborer at any time prior to the applicable redemption period upon payment of all lawful costs assessed against the animal and upon providing the dog with a valid registration tag if it has none.
- (b) A record of all <u>cats and</u> dogs impounded, the disposition of the same, the owner's name and address where known, and a statement of any costs assessed against the <u>cat or</u> dog shall be kept by any poundkeeper.
- (c) The animal warden shall not release such <u>cat</u>, dog, fowl or other domestic animal to the owner except upon payment by the owner of an impoundment fee to the City in the sum of ten dollars (\$10.00). In addition, the owner shall pay an additional impoundment fee of five dollars (\$5.00) for each day or part of a day beyond the first twenty-four hours plus any actual costs. After seventy-two hours impoundment in Macedonia, the animal warden shall deliver such animal to the County Dog Catcher and/or other appropriate agency.
- (d) Such impoundment fee shall be in addition to any fine or other cost, fixed by any other ordinance of the City or State statute wherein a criminal penalty is involved by reason of the owner or members of his household causing, suffering and permitting such cat. dog, fowl or other domestic animal to run at large.

* * *

505.08 NUISANCE CONDITIONS PROHIBITED.

- (a) No person shall keep or harbor any animal or fowl in the Municipality so as to create noxious, or offensive odors or unsanitary conditions which are a menace to the health, comfort or safety of the public.
- (b) No person shall provide food for feral cats, coyotes, raccoons, or skunks by setting such food out on any public property, or within a 100 yard radius of any private residence or public right-of-way. A feral cat is any cat that is wild, strayed or that does not have a known owner. A feral cat cannot does not constitute a pet by reason of an individual feeding it. A domestic cat turned wild shall be considered feral.
- (bc) Whoever violates this section is guilty of a minor misdemeanor for the first offense, a fourth degree misdemeanor for a second offense within one year of a prior conviction,

and a third-degree misdemeanor for a third or subsequent offense within one year of a prior conviction.

- <u>Section 2</u>. That the remainder of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Macedonia shall not be amended unless inconsistent with this Ordinance.
- <u>Section 3</u>. The Clerk of Council is authorized and directed to forward a certified copy of this Ordinance to the Codifier of the City of Macedonia.
- Section 4. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.
- <u>Section 5</u>. Wherefore, this Ordinance shall become effective upon its adoption by Council and signature of the Mayor or as otherwise be provided for in law.

CITY OF MACEDONIA ORDINANCE NO. 58 - 2024

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 153 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF MACEDONIA TO CREATE AN AUXILIARY FIRE UNIT

WHEREAS, upon recommendation of the Fire Chief, it is hereby determined to be necessary and in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of the City and its residents to amend Chapter 153 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Macedonia, Ohio to create an Auxiliary Fire Unit to assist in certain Fire Department operations;

WHEREAS, Council therefore desires utilize the City's police power for the protection of the public health, peace, property, safety and general welfare to create such Auxiliary Fire Unit to carry out non-emergency volunteer services for the City's Fire Department; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Macedonia, County of Summit and State of Ohio:

Section 1. That Chapter 153 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Macedonia shall be amended to add Section 153.08, which shall read as follows:

153.08 AUXILIARY UNIT.

(a) The Mayor/Safety Director is hereby authorized to establish a "Fire Department Auxiliary Unit" ("Auxiliary Unit"). The Auxiliary Unit shall consist of non-civil service volunteers who wish to augment City Fire Department operations by providing non-emergency services; duties shall not include fire suppression or emergency medical services. Auxiliary Unit Members shall be volunteers only, and shall not receive any pay, healthcare, or other such benefit from the City.

The Fire Chief shall prescribe the time and place such uniform or portion thereof shall be worn. Such auxiliary members shall observe the rules and regulations and traditions of the regularly constituted Fire Department, shall obey the chain of command of the Department and shall take orders from all regularly appointed members thereof.

(b) The Fire Chief, or his designee, is authorized to retain and train such number of Auxiliary Unit members as, in his judgment, are required for assistance to or augmentation of Fire Department non-suppression/non-emergency medical assistance needs. The Fire Chief shall retain a roster of current Auxiliary Unit members.

- (c) The Auxiliary Unit shall function under rules and regulations promulgated by the Fire Chief and approved by the Safety Director, except all Auxiliary Unit members shall be at least eighteen years of age at the time of appointment. All Auxiliary Unit members shall be under the supervision of the Fire Chief, who shall have control of the management, training, stationing and direction of work for all Auxiliary Unit members.
- (d) The appointment, refusal to appoint, and removal from appointment of all Auxiliary Unit members shall be at the sole discretion of the Fire Chief with input from the Safety Director. All decisions as to the appointment, refusal to appoint or removal, shall be final and without recourse or appeal.
- (e) While an Auxiliary Unit member is performing a duty assigned by the Fire Chief, they may be provided with workers' compensation coverage in accordance with Ohio Bureau of Workers' Compensation rules pertaining to fire fighters volunteering for public employers.
- <u>Section 2</u>. That the remainder of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Macedonia shall not be amended unless inconsistent with this Ordinance.
- <u>Section 3</u>. The Clerk of Council is authorized and directed to forward a certified copy of this Ordinance to the Codifier of the City of Macedonia.
- <u>Section 4</u>. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

CITY OF MACEDONIA ORDINANCE NO. 59 - 2024

AN ORDINANCE

PROVIDING FOR AND AUTHORIZING A REFUSE COLLECTION SUBSIDY FOR SENIOR CITIZENS AND MAKING APPROPRIATION FOR THAT SUBSIDY

WHEREAS, Council deems it necessary and in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of the senior citizens and for those seniors of the City of Macedonia who are seriously disabled to provide for and authorize the Refuse Collection Subsidy created pursuit to Ordinance No. 74-2006, whereby a refuse collection subsidy was established, and authorizes the Director of Finance to make appropriation for that subsidy.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Macedonia, County of Summit and State of Ohio:

Section 1. That a Refuse Collection Subsidy is hereby and herein provided for and authorized for qualifying senior citizens.

<u>Section 2</u>. Participants in the Senior Citizen Refuse Collection Subsidy must abide by the following regulations:

- 1. All applicants must be 65 years of age or older and/or seriously disabled;
- 2. The income level of all applicants must not exceed 100% of the most recent HUD very low-income limit for the Akron Ohio MSA;
- 3. All applicants must provide proof of age and/or disability;
- 4. All applicants must provide proof of income; and
- 5. Any and all other regulations adopted by the administration.

Section 3. The Director of Finance is authorized to appropriate the amount not to exceed \$15,000.00 from the unappropriated balance of the General Fund (101) in order to establish this refuse collection subsidy for senior citizens.

<u>Section 4</u>. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH VALLEY VIEW PROPERTY MAINTENANCE, L.L.C. FOR A SENIOR GUTTER CLEANING PROGRAM FOR THE 2024 FALL SEASON, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR THE SAME

WHEREAS, Council deems it necessary and in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of the senior residents of the City to provide a Senior Gutter Cleaning Program, providing a one-time only cleaning, for the 2024 Fall season; and

WHEREAS, Council authorizes the Mayor to enter into an agreement with Valley View Property Maintenance, L.L.C. to provide a one-time cleaning to the eligible seniors who have applied to the City's Department of Public Service for this Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Macedonia, County of Summit and State of Ohio:

<u>Section 1</u>. That the Senior Gutter Cleaning Program, providing a one-time only cleaning, is hereby and herein provided for the 2024 Fall season within the following guidelines:

- 1. All applicants must be residents of the City of Macedonia;
- 2. All applicants must be at least 65 years old and/or disabled and have no one living within their residence capable of cleaning their home's gutters;
- 3. Proofs of age and disability with a current physician's statement detailing the disability are required upon application;
- 4. The Program will provide one gutter cleaning for 2024 Fall season.
- 5. The income level of all applicants must not exceed 100% of the most recent HUD very low-income limit for the Akron Ohio MSA;
- 6. All applicants must provide proof of income;
- 7. The Mayor has the discretion under extraneous circumstances to increase the income threshold on case-by-case basis; and
- 8. Any and all other regulations adopted by the Administration.

- <u>Section 2</u>. That payment to Valley View Property Maintenance, L.L.C. shall be provided for, and the following sums are hereby set aside and appropriated as set forth in the document attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by reference.
- <u>Section 3</u>. The Administration has conducted a certified search of the Finding for Recovery Database on the Ohio Auditor of State website, and the proposed vendor in this contract is not listed therein.
- <u>Section 4</u>. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.
- <u>Section 5</u>. Wherefore, this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

CITY OF MACEDONIA ORDINANCE NO. 61 – 2024

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR A SENIOR SNOW REMOVAL PROGRAM FOR THE 2024-2025 WINTER SEASON

WHEREAS, Council deems it necessary and in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of the senior residents of the City to provide a Senior Snow Removal Program for the 2024-2025 winter season; and

WHEREAS, Council authorizes the Mayor to enter into an agreement with Stewart Landscaping to provide certain snow removal to the eligible seniors who have applied to the City's Department of Public Service for this Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Macedonia, County of Summit and State of Ohio:

<u>Section 1</u>. That the Senior Snow Removal Program is hereby and herein provided for the 2024-2025 winter season within the following guidelines:

- 1. All applicants must be residents of the City of Macedonia;
- 2. All applicants must be at least 65 years old and/or disabled and have no one living within their residence capable of shoveling snow;
- 3. Proofs of age and disability with a current physician's statement detailing the disability are required upon application;
- 4. The Program will provide one push of snow within a 24-hour period when snowfalls exceed 3" of new snow;
- 5. The income level of all applicants must not exceed 100% of the most recent HUD very low-income limit for the Akron, Ohio metropolitan statistical area;
- 6. All applicants must provide proof of income;
- 7. The Mayor has the discretion under extraneous circumstances to increase the income threshold on case-by-case basis; and
- 8. Any and all other regulations adopted by the Administration.

<u>Section 2</u>. That payment to Stewart Landscaping shall be provided for, and the specifications for service at a cost of \$18.50 per "push" are hereby appropriated as set forth in the document attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by reference.

- <u>Section 3</u>. The Director of Finance is authorized to undertake any and all action in order to carry out the funding for the 2024-2025 Senior Snow Removal Program.
- <u>Section 4</u>. The Administration has conducted a certified search of the Finding for Recovery Database on the Ohio Auditor of State website, and the proposed vendor in this contract is not listed therein.
- <u>Section 5</u>. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.
- **Section 6**. Wherefore, this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

CITY OF MACEDONIA RESOLUTION NO. 62 - 2024

A RESOLUTION

AUTHORIZING THE DISPOSITION OF CERTAIN MUNICIPAL PROPERTY BY THE CITY OF MACEDONIA SERVICE DEPARTMENT IN ACCORDANCE WITH CITY OF MACEDONIA CODIFIED ORDINANCE § 121.05 AND OHIO REVISED CODE § 721.15

WHEREAS, the Service Department of the City of Macedonia is in possession of the vehicles listed below, and which are no longer needed for public use, or are obsolete or unfit for the use for which they were acquired:

WHEREAS, City Codified Ordinance § 121.05 as well as Ohio Revised Code § 721.15 provide for the disposition of personal municipal property, including obsolete, or unfit equipment no longer needed for public use, or for the use for which the property was acquired, including the disposition of such property via internet auction to be authorized by the legislative authority of the municipal corporation; and

WHEREAS, Council desires to dispose of such municipal property by way of internet auction pursuant to City Codified Ordinance § 121.05 as well as Ohio Revised Code § 721.15; and

WHEREAS, Council deems it necessary and in the best interest to the health, safety and welfare of all City residents to dispose of such municipal property by internet auction.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Macedonia, Summit County and State of Ohio:

Section 1. That the Service Director for the City of Macedonia has recommended that the 2007 Ford F450 bearing VIN No. 1FDXF46P17EA02633, 2008 Ford F250 4x2 bearing VIN No. 1FTNF20588EE58718, and a 2009 Freightliner bearing VIN No. 1FV3EFAC8WH702477 that are currently in the possession of the City of Macedonia Service Department, be disposed of by internet auction after having determined that such property is no longer needed for public use, or is obsolete or unfit for the use for which it was acquired.

- <u>Section 2</u>. That upon review of the information provided by the City Service Department and its Service Director, Council hereby authorizes the sale of the property by internet auction, such property being no longer needed for public use, or is obsolete or unfit for the use for which it was acquired.
- **Section 3**. The sale of the property shall be conducted by the Service Director through the internet auction site:

- <u>Section 4</u>. The municipal property sold by internet auction shall be available for public bid for a minimum of fifteen (15) calendar days, including Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays, allotted for bidding, and the property shall be sold "AS IS" and at a minimum reserve pricing amount to be determined by the Service Director.
- <u>Section 5</u>. It is found and determined that all the formal action of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of the Resolution was adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of the Council, and any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.
- **Section 6**. Wherefore, this Resolution shall become effective upon its adoption by Council and signature of the Mayor or as otherwise be provided for in law.
