Presiding Officer, Mayor Nicholas Molnar called the August 22nd, 2024 regular Council meeting to order at 7:32p.m.

Present: Council members Jessica Brandt, Jeff Garvas, Jan Tulley and Vini J. Ventura. Also

present: Law Director Mark Guidetti and Clerk of Council Jon Hoover.

INVOCATION & PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

SWEARING-IN: Scott Ferrell was sworn in as a Sergeant with the Macedonia Police Department. In attendance were several family members and colleagues, to which Sgt. Ferrell expressed thanks for their support and patience throughout his career thus far.

 PROCLAMATION: The Mayor read a proclamation in memory of former Macedonia Council member Rosalie Koren, detailing the impact she made on those around her and her love of the community. In attendance were two sons, Bob & Joe Koren, who shared remembrances of their mother and thanked the City for their show of support.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Ms. Brandt moved, second by Mr. Garvas, to approve the minutes of the regular meeting of July 25, 2024 as received from the Clerk of Council. The motion carried by a unanimous voice vote.

INTRODUCTION, READINGS & ADOPTION OF LEGISLATION

ORDINANCE NO. 43-2024

 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 505 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF MACEDONIA REGARDING CATS was offered by Mr. Ventura for its **second reading by title only**.

Mr. Ventura shared this legislation came about after complaints from residents about loose cats causing a nuisance and up to this point there has been nothing in the code to address the issue. In Mr. Ventura's opinion "there's nothing we can do" is never an acceptable answer to resident concerns. The Police Department is not going to be searching for infractions but would serve as a tool to address concerns as they arise.

Ms. Brandt and Dir. Guidetti clarified that there is an existing ordinance which details how one needs to control owned dogs on their property, and cats would be added. In addition, there is a new subsection in 505.08 which prohibits feeding certain nuisance animals. Residents can call with input before this piece of legislation is up for a third reading at the next Council meeting.

ORDINANCE NO. 58-2024

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 153 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF MACEDONIA TO CREATE AN AUXILIARY FIRE UNIT was offered by Mr. Garvas for its **first**, **second and third readings by title only**. Seconded by Ms. Tulley. The motion carried unanimously by a voice vote.

Chief Ripley stated this creates a unit of individuals with special skills who will not have any fire or EMS responsibilities. Two interested individuals would serve as a chaplain addressing mental health and a

- drone instructor. These are unpaid volunteers and would not affect the status of the Fire Department whatsoever.
- 57 Mr. Garvas moved, second by Ms. Tulley, to adopt ORD.NO. 58-2024 and post the same according to law. Motion carried by a unanimous voice vote. ORD.NO. 58-2024 declared and adopted.

ORDINANCE NO. 59-2024

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- AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR AND AUTHORIZING A REFUSE COLLECTION SUBSIDY FOR SENIOR CITIZENS AND MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR THAT SUBSIDY was offered by
- Mr. Garvas for its **first, second and third readings by title only**. Seconded by Ms. Tulley. The motion carried unanimously by a voice vote.
- The Mayor shared that this is an annual program the City provides for seniors under a certain income level to help subsidize the cost of trash pickup.
- Mr. Garvas moved, second by Ms. Tulley, to adopt ORD.NO. 59-2024 and post the same according to law. Motion carried by a unanimous voice vote. ORD.NO. 59-2024 declared and adopted.

ORDINANCE NO. 60-2024

ORDINANCE NO. 61-2024

- AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR A SENIOR SNOW REMOVAL PROGRAM FOR THE 2024-2025 WINTER SEASON was offered by Ms. Brandt for its **first, second and third readings by title only**. Seconded by Mr. Ventura. The motion carried unanimously by a voice vote.
- 89 The Mayor once again stated this is similar to the previous two ordinances, but for snow plowing.
- 91 Ms. Brandt moved, second by Mr. Ventura, to adopt ORD.NO. 61-2024 and post the same according to law. Motion carried by a unanimous voice vote. ORD.NO. 61-2024 declared and adopted.

RESOLUTION NO. 62-2024

- Mr. Ventura moved, second by Mr. Garvas, to adopt RES.NO. 62-2024 and post the same according to law. Motion carried by a unanimous voice vote. RES.NO. 62-2024 declared and adopted.

MAYOR'S REPORT

COMMITTEE REPORTS
Parks & Recreation Commission: Ms. Brandt stated the Commission met on August 14. Thanks to Dir. Gigliotti for the good news on paved trails and that the project should be completed sooner and less expensive than was expected. Discussion continued regarding upcoming long-term projects the Commission is interested in getting Council to approve and appear on the 5-year capital plan. The next meeting will be on September 18 at 6pm.
Finance Committee: Mr. Ventura stated the Finance Committee will meet prior to the Council work session on September 12 and begin to lockdown 2024 and open 2025 discussion of finances. There will be no "Office Hours" on days where there is a Finance Committee meeting (September 12, 26 and October 24).
DEPARTMENT REPORTS
Service Department: Director Wilson – Thanks for the senior services legislation and Administrative Assistant Laura Butto for putting it altogether. The salt bid for Summit County was awarded to Morton. A new full-time maintenance worker, Larry Kalal has been hired. Renovation work being done in dispatch. Slowly rolling out a new work order system with the help of Dir. Gigliotti's team.
Engineer : Director Gigliotti – Longwood Park is currently under construction repaving all of the driveways at the Park and Rec Center. Work is scheduled to be completed by the end of next week.
Parks and Recreation Department: — Director Chadock — Longwood North being renovated and should be planted in the next two weeks, with play resuming in the Fall of 2025. Soccer fields are currently set up in Longwood South and conversations have been had with residents on Park Ridge Lane and soccer participants to respect the neighbors and stay out of yards. Thanks to Cindy Funk for

rescheduling the Touch-a-Truck event following the prior week's postponement due to weather. Fall sports season is kicking off the week after Labor Day.

<u>Finance Department</u>: Director Veres – Still processing RITA resident refunds for those that have extensions. A new employee, Lexi Hall, has started and is helping in Mayor's Court. Check from the Royal Chemical incident for \$32,355 has been received to reimburse the City.

The Mayor thanked Finance and HR for their versatility in assisting where needed.

<u>IT Department</u>: Director Collins – 53 help desk tickets closed since last meeting. Major projects include update on LEADS compliance.

<u>Building Department</u>: Commissioner Monaco – Sidewalk program progressing with Sherwood Drive almost completed and working on Hampton Drive. If anyone receives complaints, please let the Building Department know so they can address them. The house on 1250 E Twinsburg has been demolished and a search warrant is being obtained for the adjacent property at 1264 E Twinsburg. In the process of interviewing companies for new building software. Still in search of Assistant Building Commissioner.

Dir. Veres added that he is working on special assessments on the demolition of the two properties, alarm drops, water M&E and noxious weeds. The total for this year has been approximately \$40,000.

The Mayor added the legislation regarding noxious weeds is working and the City is moving in a positive direction.

Ms. Tulley commended the administration for working well with the owner of the demolished property. She further asked if anyone is living at the house on Valley View Road that recently had a fire, to which the Mayor responded it is uninhabitable and nobody is living there. Chief Ripley added the insurance company is working through the process of their investigation and paying out the claim.

<u>HR Department</u>: Director Smith – Offer has been extended to a new Clerk of Court. Creation of iSolved safety training is complete. Health Fair is scheduled for October 5.

The Mayor added the most recent Clerk of Court resigned and took another position for personal reasons and of her own accord.

Mr. Ventura stated the previous Health Fair was fantastic and asked how the next will be structured, to which Dir. Smith replied it will be inside this year.

197 <u>Fire Department</u>: Chief Ripley – Senior report included a summary of recent trips, classes offered, and
 198 meal delivery services.

All floors in the Fire Department have been resurfaced as part of the planned capital program.

<u>Police Department</u>: Chief Yakopovich – Thanks to resident donations. Two Civil Service examination windows are still open, one for patrol officer and one for full-time dispatcher. The deadline to submit application materials is September 3 and more info can be found on the City's website.

<u>Law Department</u>: Director Guidetti – Expressed appreciation for Council addressing budget issues in advance of the next year.

CITY OF MACEDONIA ORDINANCE NO. 43 - 2024

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 505 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF MACEDONIA REGARDING CATS

WHEREAS, cats roaming at large, and the feeding of feral cats and certain other animals, create nuisance conditions for residents and others within the City of Macedonia, Ohio; and

WHEREAS, it is hereby determined to be necessary and in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of the City and its residents to amend Chapter 505 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Macedonia, Ohio regarding the regulation of cats located within the City;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Macedonia, County of Summit and State of Ohio:

Section 1. That Sections 505.01, 505.02, and 505.08 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Macedonia shall be amended to read as follows:

* * *

505.01 DOGS, CATS, AND OTHER ANIMALS RUNNING AT LARGE.

- (a) No person being the owner or having charge of horses, mules, cattle, bison, sheep, goats, swine, llamas, alpacas, geese, ducks, turkeys, chickens or other fowl or animals shall permit them to run at large upon any public place, or upon any unenclosed lands, or upon the premises of another.
- (b) No person being the owner of or having charge of any <u>cat or</u> dog, whether wearing a registration tag or not, shall permit it to run at large upon any public place or upon the premises of another. No owner, keeper or harborer of any female dog shall permit such dog to go beyond the premises of such owner or keeper at any time such dog is in heat, unless such dog is properly <u>io</u>n leash. The owner or keeper or every dog shall at all times keep such dog either confined upon the premises of the owner or keeper, or under reasonable control of some person.
- (c) The running at large of any such animal in or upon any of the places mentioned in this section is prima-facie evidence that it is running at large in violation of this section.
- (d) Whoever violates this section is guilty of a minor misdemeanor for a first offense and a misdemeanor of the fourth degree for each subsequent offense.

505.02 IMPOUNDING AND DISPOSITION; RECORDS.

- (a) A police officer or animal warden may impound every animal, cat or dog found in violation of Section 505.01. If the owner of the cat is not reasonably determined, or if the dog is not wearing a valid registration tag and the owner is not otherwise reasonably determined, notice shall be posted in the pound or animal shelter both describing the cat or dog and the place where seized and advising the unknown owner that unless the cat or dog is redeemed within three days, it may thereafter be sold or destroyed according to law. If the dog is wearing a valid registration tag or the identity of the owner, keeper or harborer is otherwise reasonably determined, notice shall be given by certified mail to such owner, keeper or harborer that the dog has been impounded and unless redeemed within fourteen days of the date of notice, it may thereafter be sold or destroyed according to law. Any cat or dog seized and impounded may be redeemed by its owner, keeper or harborer at any time prior to the applicable redemption period upon payment of all lawful costs assessed against the animal and upon providing the dog with a valid registration tag if it has none.
- (b) A record of all <u>cats and</u> dogs impounded, the disposition of the same, the owner's name and address where known, and a statement of any costs assessed against the <u>cat or</u> dog shall be kept by any poundkeeper.
- (c) The animal warden shall not release such <u>cat</u>, dog, fowl or other domestic animal to the owner except upon payment by the owner of an impoundment fee to the City in the sum of ten dollars (\$10.00). In addition, the owner shall pay an additional impoundment fee of five dollars (\$5.00) for each day or part of a day beyond the first twenty-four hours plus any actual costs. After seventy-two hours impoundment in Macedonia, the animal warden shall deliver such animal to the County Dog Catcher and/or other appropriate agency.
- (d) Such impoundment fee shall be in addition to any fine or other cost, fixed by any other ordinance of the City or State statute wherein a criminal penalty is involved by reason of the owner or members of his household causing, suffering and permitting such cat. dog, fowl or other domestic animal to run at large.

* * *

505.08 NUISANCE CONDITIONS PROHIBITED.

- (a) No person shall keep or harbor any animal or fowl in the Municipality so as to create noxious, or offensive odors or unsanitary conditions which are a menace to the health, comfort or safety of the public.
- (b) No person shall provide food for feral cats, coyotes, raccoons, or skunks by setting such food out on any public property, or within a 100 yard radius of any private residence or public right-of-way. A feral cat is any cat that is wild, strayed or that does not have a known owner. A feral cat cannot does not constitute a pet by reason of an individual feeding it. A domestic cat turned wild shall be considered feral.
- (bc) Whoever violates this section is guilty of a minor misdemeanor for the first offense, a fourth degree misdemeanor for a second offense within one year of a prior conviction,

and a third-degree misdemeanor for a third or subsequent offense within one year of a prior conviction.

* * *

- <u>Section 2</u>. That the remainder of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Macedonia shall not be amended unless inconsistent with this Ordinance.
- <u>Section 3</u>. The Clerk of Council is authorized and directed to forward a certified copy of this Ordinance to the Codifier of the City of Macedonia.
- Section 4. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.
- <u>Section 5</u>. Wherefore, this Ordinance shall become effective upon its adoption by Council and signature of the Mayor or as otherwise be provided for in law.

CITY OF MACEDONIA ORDINANCE NO. 63 – 2024

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING THE EDITING AND INCLUSION, AND AMENDMENT, OF CERTAIN ORDINANCES AS PARTS OF THE VARIOUS COMPONENT CODES OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF MACEDONIA

WHEREAS, various statutes of a general and permanent nature have been passed by the Ohio General Assembly which should be included by incorporation into the Codified Ordinances of Macedonia, Ohio; and

WHEREAS, consistent with the above, Council desires to revise certain sections of the Administrative, Traffic and General Offenses Codes of the City in order to reflect City Council's recent prior amendments to the Codified Ordinances, and to reflect the current law in Ohio as set forth below.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Macedonia, Summit County, State of Ohio:

<u>Section 1</u>. That the amendment through recodification, editing, arrangement, and numbering or renumbering of the following ordinances and parts of ordinances is hereby approved as parts of the various component codes of the Codified Ordinances of Macedonia, Ohio, so as to conform to the classification and numbering system of the Codified Ordinances, to-wit:

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission has further recommended at its July 15, 2024 Planning Commission meeting that the requirement of the construction of full sidewalks be waived, and a minimum of sidewalks on one side of the road be allowed in regard to the Valley Reserve Subdivision, pursuant to Macedonia Codified Ordinance § 1163.05(h)(2); and

WHEREAS, Council therefore wishes to confirm said conditional zoning certificate relative to the Valley Reserve Subdivision planned unit development project, and waive the requirement for the construction of full sidewalks as set forth herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Macedonia, County of Summit and State of Ohio:

Section 1. That the conditional zoning certificate issued by the Planning Commission is hereby and herein confirmed, contingent upon all recommendations and requirements imposed by the Planning Commission being adhered to, and that the requirement for the construction of full sidewalks be waived, and the requirement for sidewalks for the Valley Reserve Subdivision planned unit development project be modified so as to require the installation of sidewalks on one side on the road, and allowing 7'6" side setbacks (resulting in 15' between buildings) consistent with the Planning Commission's approval, and as set forth in the document attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit "A."


