AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 1179 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF MACEDONIA RELATIVE TO SIGN REGULATIONS

Relative to ORD. NO. 96-2019 City Planner Brian Frantz informed Council and the public that the review and update of the sign code began in 2018. What Mr. Frantz described as a complete and comprehensive revision of the code was accomplished in three phases utilizing the efforts of city staff and the Planning Commission. Recent court cases that effect sign ordinances in general were also considered in the review process.

 Resident Sue Metzel who is also a member of the Board of Zoning and Code Appeals questioned Mr. Frantz if more signs will be allowed under the new code to which he answered the number of permitted signs remains the same. Continuing, Mr. Frantz added however that the code relative to temporary signage was completely updated by making them less discriminatory; equalizing them between zoning districts and providing that they be more in concert with court cases all of which should be beneficial from the perspective of the BZA.

As there were no further comments from the public and there being no other further business before Council, the public hearing was adjourned at 7:20 PM.

191	Parks & Recreation Commission Ms. Brandt announced the first P&RC of 2020 will be Wednesday
192	January 15 th at 6 p.m. Thereafter the meetings will be held on the third Wednesday's of each month.

<u>Northfield-Macedonia Cemetery Board</u> Ms. Tulley announced that due to Mr. Friess' passing Attorney Jeff Snell has been appointed interim clerk-treasurer and manager of operation of the cemetery.

<u>JEDD Board</u> Mr. Ventura announced the Board approved adding 21+ acres north of the Spitzer car dealership to the territory of the JEDD. This acreage was previously approved of by both Macedonia and Northfield Center Township, partners in the JEDD.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS

Service Department Director Hnottavange reported the department was able to complete seven rounds of leaf collection before the holidays because of unprecedented warmer weather. The department is now in the process of preparing its fleet for snow removal.

Building Commissioner

Engineer Mr. Gigliotti reported that Summit County has begun the County's sanitary sewer project that is located in the wooded area between N. Bedford, Crow, Berkshire and Hampton. Residents were notified of the project by the County. Mr. Gigliotti also announced that the water main replacement project sponsorship by Cleveland Water is on Ledgeview Road and not Ledge Road as erroneously reported in the *NewsLeader*.

Recreation Department Ms. Manley announced that the Recreation Center is experiencing a burst in membership in part because of New Year's resolution for healthier living. The Recreation Center continues to offer a variety of specials including a promotion of \$20 per month which allows the user participation in all group classes.

<u>Finance Department</u> Director Veres reported that the WM&E special assessment of \$20.80 (annual fee) now appears on every resident's property tax bill.

<u>Fire Department</u> Chief Ripley reported the department covered 3871 calls in 2019, up 180 calls from 2018.

<u>Police Department</u> Chief Golden advised motorists to use good quality navigation systems or apps like Waze to avoid traffic congestion and construction or areas of accidents. Some systems are not current enough and do not reroute motorists as they should thus causing more confusion than good.

Law Department Mr. Guidetti had no report.

Unfinished business Council President Tulley asked Mr. Gigliotti the status of double drive-through at Chick a fils and the situation relative to Our Lady of Guadeloupe to which the engineer answered the construction for double drives which he added is standard in most of Chick a fils is on schedule. Regarding OLG, Law Director Guidetti interjected that a teleconference was held today with officials of the Cleveland Diocese in an effort to move the project along. Ms. Tulley mentioned too the lights in the parking lot of the church that are on all night for visitors to Perpetual Adoration. Ms. Tulley complained that the lights are a nuisance as they shine into the homes of neighboring residents. Ms. Tulley also questioned how long flags marking utility lines must remain in place to which Engineer Gigliotti answered the flags must be installed at least 48-hours before a dig but no more than 10-days before
