APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Ms. Brandt moved, second by Mr. Garvas, to approve the minutes of the regular meeting of August 25, 2022 as received from the Clerk of Council. The motion carried unanimously upon a voice vote.

PUBLIC COMMENTS:

~Chad Lahrmer, 185 Hiram College Drive, Sagamore Hills, is a member of the Nordonia Hills Board of Education. He stated that it is estimated that 80% of the Nordonia community does not have a direct connection to the schools, either because they don't have children, their children are in private schools, or have already graduated. He shared that on Saturday, September 10th from 9am-1pm, the Nordonia Hills School District will be hosting a walkthrough of all the schools in the district and invites everyone to come visit and see the condition of the facilities firsthand.

~Gabriel Kramer, 2106 W 110th Street, Cleveland, is a reporter for Ideastream Public Media and stated the company expanded from covering 17 counties to 23 earlier this year, and he wanted to introduce himself and meet people in the areas that he will be covering.

<u>CORRESPONDENCE</u>: The Clerk of Council shared that three more residents gave feedback in favor of allowing residents to discharge fireworks as long as they are done in a safe manner.

Chief Golden reported this legislation creates the position of part-time School Resource Officer (SRO). Dir. Guidetti added that ORD 60-2022 is contingent on passage of the ordinance at hand.

Ms. Brandt moved, second by Mr. Ventura, to adopt ORD.NO. 59-2022 and post the same according to law. Motion carried unanimously by a voice vote. ORD.NO. 59-2022 declared and adopted.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

<u>Parks & Recreation Commission:</u> Ms. Brandt reported the Commission's next meeting will be on Wednesday, September 21st at 6pm. Exact location in the Recreation Center is to be determined, but those interested in attending can ask for the location at the front desk.

Finance Committee: Mr. Garvas stated the Finance Committee will hold its next meeting ninety minutes prior to the work session that precedes the Council meeting on September 22nd.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS

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116 positions needing filled, and now there only remains one. 117

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Service Department: Director Wilson – Leaf equipment is being readied as Fall approaches, with the start date of leaf season happening around October 24th. The hanging flower baskets are being taken down for the season. The supervisor position that was approved at the last Council meeting will be posted. When Dir. Wilson began working for the City there were four full-time maintenance technician

Engineer: Director Gigliotti – The lines on Route 8 and Route 82 have been repainted. The Valley View Road project south of Twinsburg Road is scheduled to be paved during the second half of 2023.

Parks and Recreation Department: Director Chadock – Trail maps and directional arrows are being worked on to provide directions and distances. Also in Longwood Park, brush clearing has taken place and it looks beautiful. The flooring project within the Recreation Center is ongoing, with the hope of completion in 2022. Fall sports programs are serving 391 participants, which is a 43% increase from 2019, which was one of the highest revenue years ever as a department. For perspective, this year's programming is up 22% from last year. FallFest is taking place on Saturday, September 17 from 4:30 to 9:30pm in Longwood Park. Admission to the event is free, but drink tickets are available to purchase.

Finance Department: Director Veres – Absent

Fire Department: Chief Ripley – Hydrant flushing is complete in Macedonia, but work continues in the two townships. Due to staffing issues, off-duty firefighters will complete the work. Supply chain issues continue to push back receipt of a new ambulance chassis, with the hope of receiving it by the end of this year. Also waiting for the new fire truck, which will not arrive until 2023 at the earliest. With Fall here, a reminder to residents that it is illegal to burn yard waste, which includes leaves. Push leaves to the tree lawn area for the Service Department to pick up – not the street itself.

Upon the question from Mr. Ventura, Chief Ripley reported the union will be holding a fundraiser October 1 at the VFW in Northfield.

Police Department: Chief Golden – Thanks to Council for passing the two pieces of legislation for the SRO. The Flock cameras recently picked up a vehicle suspected of being involved in a breaking and entering.

HR Department: Director Smith – Working to cover the Clerk of Courts office and excited for the new Clerk of Courts to start work on September 19th. Less than a week away from the first outdoor health fair, and while the weather forecast is looking questionable, a "Plan B" is in place for an indoor location.

The Mayor asked Dir. Smith to expound upon the credentials of the incoming Clerk of Courts, which includes approximately 25 years working in Mayor's Courts and great knowledge of the systems needed to run one.

Building Department: Commissioner Rodic – Reported working with the homeowner's association of the Reserve at North Woods regarding their conflict with S&A development. He walked the site yesterday with a representative of S&A and has more research to do but expects to have a report with his findings by the end of next week.

CITY OF MACEDONIA ORDINANCE NO. 49 - 2022

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE DECLARING IMPROVEMENTS TO A CERTAIN PARCEL OF REAL PROPERTY TO BE A PUBLIC PURPOSE, DESCRIBING THE PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS TO BE MADE WHICH DIRECTLY BENEFIT SUCH PARCEL, REQUIRING THE OWNER OF THE IMPROVEMENTS ON SUCH PARCEL TO MAKE SERVICE PAYMENTS IN LIEU OF TAXES, ESTABLISHING AN "OPTIMA MUNICIPAL PUBLIC IMPROVEMENT TAX INCREMENT EQUIVALENT FUND" FOR THE DEPOSIT OF SUCH SERVICE PAYMENTS PURSUANT TO OHIO REVISED CODE SECTIONS 5709.40, 5709.42 & 5709.43

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code ("R.C.") §§ 5709.40, 5709.42 and 5709.43 authorize City Council to describe public improvements to be made which will directly benefit parcels of real property, to declare Improvements (as defined in R.C. § 5709.40) with respect to such parcels to be a public purpose, thereby authorizing the exemption of those Improvements from real property taxation for a period of years, and to provide for the making of service payments in lieu of taxes by the owner of such parcels and to establish a municipal public improvement tax increment equivalent fund into which such service payments shall be deposited; and

WHEREAS, to improve the flow of traffic in and around the parcel described in the document attached as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by reference, as such parcel may be consolidated or split (the "Property"), Council may cause construction of one or more of the public improvements described in the document attached as Exhibit "B" and incorporated herein by reference (collectively, the "Public Improvements"), that once made will directly benefit the Property and the City and its residents; and

WHEREAS, the City has determined that it is necessary and appropriate and in the City's best interest to provide for service payments in lieu of taxes with respect to the Property pursuant to R.C. § 5709.42 (the "Service Payments") to pay the costs of the Public Improvements; and

WHEREAS, the Property is located within the boundaries of the Nordonia Hills City School District and within the service area of the Cuyahoga Valley Career Center (together, the "School Districts"), and the School Districts have been notified of the City's intent to pass this Ordinance in accordance with R.C.§§ 5709.40(D) and 5709.83, as applicable to each; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Macedonia, Summit County, Ohio, that:

Section 1. The Public Improvements described in Exhibit "B," if made or caused to be made by the City, are designated as those Public Improvements that directly benefit, or that once

made will directly benefit, the Property, and are determined to be necessary for the public health, safety and welfare of the City and its residents.

Section 2. Pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of R.C. § 5709.40, and, in particular, R.C. § 5709.40 subsection (B), Council finds and determines that 100% of the increase in the assessed value of the Property that would first appear on the tax list and duplicate of real property after the effective date of this Ordinance (which increase in assessed value is referred to in this Ordinance as the "Improvement" or "Improvements" as defined in R.C. § 5709.40) is a public purpose, and 100% of that Improvement is declared to be a public purpose for a period of 30 years and exempt from taxation commencing with the tax year following the year in which this Ordinance is passed and ending on the earlier of (a) the date the Improvements have been exempted from taxation for a period of 30 years or (b) the date on which the City has collected into the Fund established in Section 4 hereof a total amount of Service Payments available for and sufficient to pay the costs provided in Section 4 hereof; provided, however, that Service Payments shall be paid to the Nordonia Hills City School District and the Cuyahoga Valley Career Center in the amount of the taxes that would have been payable to the Nordonia Hills City School District and the Cuyahoga Valley Career Center, as applicable, if the Improvements had not been exempted from taxation.

Section 3. As provided in R.C. § 5709.42, the owner or owners of the Improvements are required to, and shall make, annual Service Payments to the County Fiscal Officer on or before the final dates for payment of real property taxes due and payable with respect to the Improvements. In accordance with R.C. § 5709.42, the County Fiscal Officer is requested to distribute a portion of the Service Payments directly to the Nordonia Hills City School District and to the Cuyahoga Valley Career Center in the amounts equal to the real property tax payments that the two School Districts would have received, respectively, had the Improvements not been exempted from real property taxation pursuant to this Ordinance. The Service Payments, when distributed to the City by the County Fiscal Officer, shall be deposited in the "OPTIMA Tax Increment Equivalent Fund" established in Section 4 hereof. Council authorizes the Mayor, Finance Director and City Law Director, and other appropriate officers of the City, to provide such information and certifications and to execute and deliver or accept delivery of such instruments as are necessary and incidental to collection of those Service Payments, and to make such arrangements as are necessary and proper for payment of those Service Payments.

Section 4. Council hereby establishes, pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of R.C. § 5709.43, the "OPTIMA Tax Increment Equivalent Fund" (the "Fund"), into which shall be deposited all of the Service Payments distributed to the City with respect to the Improvements, by or on behalf of the County Fiscal Officer as provided in R.C. § 5709.42, and provides that all of the moneys deposited in the Fund shall be used for any or all of the following purposes:

- (a) to pay any or all acquisition, construction, planning, engineering, installation or financing costs, and any or all other direct and indirect costs of the Public Improvements, including those costs set forth in R.C. § 133.15(B);
- (b) to pay the interest on, principal of, and any premium on bonds or notes or other obligations, including refunding bonds or notes or other obligations issued by the

City or other authorized entity, to finance costs of the Public Improvements until such notes or bonds or other obligations are paid in full;

- (c) to reimburse the City for any funds used by the City to pay costs of the Public Improvements; or
- (d) to pay, or to apply or transfer funds toward the payment of interest, principal or premium on any of the aforesaid notes, bonds, loans or other obligations prior to receipt of Service Payments.

The Fund shall remain in existence so long as Service Payments are collected and used for the aforesaid purposes, after which time the Fund shall be dissolved in accordance with R.C. § 5709.43.

Section 5. Pursuant to R.C. § 5709.40, the Clerk of Council is directed to deliver a copy of this Ordinance to the Director of Development of the State of Ohio within 15 days after its passage. On or before March 31st of each year that the exemption set forth in Section 3 hereof remains in effect, the Mayor or other authorized officer of this City shall prepare and submit to the Director of Development of the State of Ohio the status report required under R.C. § 5709.40.

Section 6. WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code ("R.C.") §§ 5709.40, 5709.42 and 5709.43 authorize Council to describe public improvements to be made which will directly benefit parcels of real property, to declare Improvements (as defined in R.C. § 5709.40) with respect to such parcels to be a public purpose, thereby authorizing the exemption of those Improvements from real property taxation for a period of years, and to provide for the making of service payments in lieu of taxes by the owner of such parcels and to establish a municipal public improvement tax increment equivalent fund into which such service payments shall be deposited; and

WHEREAS, the City has determined that it is necessary and appropriate and in the City's best interest to provide for service payments in lieu of taxes with respect to the Property pursuant to R.C. § 5709.42 (the "Service Payments") to pay the costs of the Public Improvements; and

WHEREAS, the Property is located within the boundaries of the Nordonia Hills City School District and within the service area of the Cuyahoga Valley Career Center (together, the "School Districts"), and the School Districts have been notified of the City's intent to pass this Ordinance in accordance with R.C. §§ 5709.40(D) and 5709.83, as applicable to each; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Macedonia, Summit County, Ohio, that:

Section 1. The Public Improvements described in Exhibit "B," if made or caused to be made by the City, are designated as those Public Improvements that directly benefit, or that once

made will directly benefit, the Property, and are determined to be necessary for the public health, safety and welfare of the City and its residents.

Section 2. Pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of R.C. § 5709.40, and, in particular, R.C. § 5709.40 subsection (B), Council finds and determines that 100% of the increase in the assessed value of the Property that would first appear on the tax list and duplicate of real property after the effective date of this Ordinance (which increase in assessed value is referred to in this Ordinance as the "Improvement" or "Improvements" as defined in R.C. § 5709.40) is a public purpose, and 100% of that Improvement is declared to be a public purpose for a period of 30 years and exempt from taxation commencing with the tax year following the year in which this Ordinance is passed and ending on the earlier of (a) the date the Improvements have been exempted from taxation for a period of 30 years or (b) the date on which the City has collected into the Fund established in Section 4 hereof a total amount of Service Payments available for and sufficient to pay the costs provided in Section 4 hereof; provided, however, that Service Payments shall be paid to the Nordonia Hills City School District and the Cuyahoga Valley Career Center in the amount of the taxes that would have been payable to the Nordonia Hills City School District and the Cuyahoga Valley Career Center, as applicable, if the Improvements had not been exempted from taxation.

Section 3. As provided in R.C. § 5709.42, the owner or owners of the Improvements are required to, and shall make, annual Service Payments to the County Fiscal Officer on or before the final dates for payment of real property taxes due and payable with respect to the Improvements. In accordance with R.C. § 5709.42, the County Fiscal Officer is requested to distribute a portion of the Service Payments directly to the Nordonia Hills City School District and to the Cuyahoga Valley Career Center in the amounts equal to the real property tax payments that the two School Districts would have received, respectively, had the Improvements not been exempted from real property taxation pursuant to this Ordinance. The Service Payments, when distributed to the City by the County Fiscal Officer, shall be deposited in the "SPACE PLACE Tax Increment Equivalent Fund" established in Section 4 hereof. This Council authorizes the Mayor, Finance Director and City Law Director, and other appropriate officers of the City, to provide such information and certifications and to execute and deliver or accept delivery of such instruments as are necessary and incidental to collection of those Service Payments, and to make such arrangements as are necessary and proper for payment of those Service Payments.

Section 4. Council hereby establishes, pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of R.C. § 5709.43, the "SPACE PLACE Tax Increment Equivalent Fund" (the "Fund"), into which shall be deposited all of the Service Payments distributed to the City with respect to the Improvements, by or on behalf of the County Fiscal Officer as provided in R.C. § 5709.42, and provides that all of the moneys deposited in the Fund shall be used for any or all of the following purposes:

- (a) to pay any or all acquisition, construction, planning, engineering, installation or financing costs, and any or all other direct and indirect costs of the Public Improvements, including those costs set forth in R.C. § 133.15(B);
- (b) to pay the interest on, principal of, and any premium on bonds or notes or other obligations, including refunding bonds or notes or other obligations issued by the

City or other authorized entity, to finance costs of the Public Improvements until such notes or bonds or other obligations are paid in full;

- (c) to reimburse the City for any funds used by the City to pay costs of the Public Improvements; or
- (d) to pay, or to apply or transfer funds toward the payment of interest, principal or premium on any of the aforesaid notes, bonds, loans or other obligations prior to receipt of Service Payments.

The Fund shall remain in existence so long as Service Payments are collected and used for the aforesaid purposes, after which time the Fund shall be dissolved in accordance with R.C. § 5709.43.

Section 5. Pursuant to R.C. § 5709.40, the Clerk of Council is directed to deliver a copy of this Ordinance to the Director of Development of the State of Ohio within 15 days after its passage. The Tax Commissioner, upon consideration of the application filed by the County Auditor, as secretary of the county budget commission, on July 7, 2022, for an extension of time beyond the statutory date of September first to complete its work, as provided by Revised Code section 5705.27, finds that the extension of time is necessary and approves October 3, 2022, as the date within which such work shall be completed, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code section 5705.341 (last para.).

The Tax Commissioner also extends the October first deadline contained in Ohio Revised Code section 5705.34 for the political subdivision to authorize the necessary tax levies to the auditor by the same number of days that the extension to certify rates is granted by this entry. Accordingly, the political subdivision must authorize the necessary tax levies to the auditor by November 3, 2022. The County Auditor must notify each political subdivision affected by this entry.

It is ordered that a copy of this entry be certified to the County Auditor, as secretary of the County Budget Commission.

1) Income Tax amended based upon collections thru September. Added \$11,300 Transfer In from Unclaimed Monies (103) for amount eligible to go to General Fund.

2) Unclaimed Monies (103) – added estimated revenues of \$4,200.

3) S,C,M&R (201) - \$75,000 added to Transfer In from General (101).

4) OneOhio (267) – added fund and estimated revenue of \$106,100 from Opiod settlement.

5) Spec Assess Bond Retirement (302) – added \$40,000 Transfer In for City's 13.97% share. Added \$164,000 for cash payments made towards Right In / Right Out assessment. Adjusted borrowed amount to \$475,000.
